







Information about a project financed from Norway Grants "Prevention of Paediatric Injuries at University Hospital Ostrava"

Information as of 7th April 2017

The project is being realized in accordance with the adjusted time schedule, based upon the approved changes and extension of the realization period until 30th April 2017. Almost all activities of the project have been accomplished. The last remaining activity is the supply of equipment for the newly-constructed trauma units. Within this activity, new educational tools and aids have been created, namely information brochures for correct physiotherapy after injuries (e.g. of upper extremities, pelvis, lower extremities, etc.); furthermore, there were two educational DVDs made containing educational programmes in the area of mobility, respiratory physiotherapy, and treatment of paediatric fractures. These materials are available for paediatric patients and their parents at respective FNO departments. Inevitable part of the educational activity was also the participation of FNO employees upon educational courses held outside of FNO, and organising own educational events for the staff and external participants from other establishments. Traumatology Centre of the University Hospital Ostrava organized also, among others, Interdisciplinary symposium of paediatric trauma surgeons, surgeons and physiotherapists in Rožnov pod Radhoštěm. There were also construction works realized within the project, resulting in the construction of one trauma unit, which was immediately put into operation. Another trauma unit will be established in the area of gymnasium of the Department of Paediatric Medicine, the reconstruction of which was covered from the hospital's own financial resources.

At present, the realization of individual project activities suggests that all project activities shall be duly performed and the aims of the project will be met.
